GENERAL

Intercollegiate sport in 2019 was a success across the board. SUSF strives to provide the best possible on-campus experience for the college residents and it is clear to see that the spirit of Intercol is alive and well. Congratulations to St Andrew's College for their success in taking out both the Rosebowl and Rawson Cup competitions this year. The women in the sky-blue & white were especially dominant this year, winning every event except for rowing.

All athletes, convenors and spectators should be proud of their contribution to keeping this sporting tradition so strong. Spectator behaviour was the best it has been for many years. With the exception of one incident at the final evening of the soccer, all College residents can be commended on the way they conducted themselves at all events.

2019 saw the introduction of the Sancta Men vs College All Stars exhibition basketball match. This was also played in good spirits and will no doubt be a permanent fixture on the social calendar. The Sancta men also performed with enthusiasm at the Swimming and Athletics events. Unfortunately they were not able to field a rowing crew this year.

The Women's 7s Rugby proved to be another popular event. It is an ideal curtain-raiser to the final night of Rawson rugby fixtures. It feels like it is only a matter of time for this event to become an official Rosebowl sport worth points contributing to overall standings. We also had the privilege of being able to play the final round of soccer fixtures under lights on the Sydney Uni Football Ground (SUFG). The evening timeslots served as the perfect excuse to host another alumni event for past college dwellers. A massive thank you to Daryl Davidson and his SUSF Grounds Team for preparing the premier ground on campus for the rugby and soccer events. Along with the Rosebowl and Rawson Cups, the MVPs for each sport were also awarded. Incidents/Recommendations for 2020:

- We were very lucky with the weather this year. The scheduled “final” date was touch and go all day, with a number of interruptions during play. Fortunately, we were able to get a result.

- For future years I would recommend the changing of any washed out games to move to T/20 format so that there is less impact on sessions missed. Currently T/20’s are not an option unless agreed on by both captains pending the situation on the day and this becomes time consuming.

- Feedback from the umpires was that the spectators were the best behaved in recent memory. All chanting and banter was delivered in good spirits.
- Security guards were not used at all this year. There was no evidence of any alcohol being brought in to the facility.
- We had a number of injuries throughout the tournament. I am unaware of the training regime leading into the event for the netball girls. A stronger focus on strength & conditioning may result in fewer injuries, however time is an obvious restricting factor.

Incidents/Recommendations for 2020:

- The structure around the B-lane relay was better this year than in previous years. This was due to colleges discussing planned strokes for each section of the race. Even though this race was improved, questions still remain on how this race affects the professionalism of the whole event.
- Continue to use two security guards at the entrance of SOPAC . They are beneficial to the event as they ensure bag checks prior to entry and to monitor spectators and restrict access to diving platforms. The crowd was very well behaved this year. There was no evidence of alcohol being brought into the facility, and all bag checks came up clean.
- The Diving event could be organised far more effectively. It is very time consuming to have competitors submitting their dives on the night. Despite numerous requests to have them submitted beforehand, only two colleges did so. This needs to be enforced for future carnivals to avoid scrambling on the night. Logistics aside, it is a very entertaining event, despite the somewhat amateur standard. The crowd really gets behind the competitors, and is great for the “esprit de corps”.
- One of the MCs needs to be stationed in the results room. This will ensure all events are marshalled in a timely fashion, and all results are read out as the night progresses. The overall standings for the carnival also need to be communicated before the spectator leave the facility.
- Rotate mens/womens relays each year (and potentially Individual Medley scheduled immediately before relays) so that event can finish with men’s or women’s relays on a rotating basis.

Incidents/Recommendations for 2020:

- Schedule change of event after initial calendar confirmed despite all clear from venue. This was due to Rowing Australia holding World Cup simulation races. All colleges were very understanding and happy to work around them at late notice.
- An accident on the M4 saw many volunteers and spectators arriving late. Race times were pushed back to allow everyone to get there on time. Again, SIRC staff and colleges were all flexible and happy with this decision.
- The crowd, albeit relatively small, was extremely well behaved. Level of security needed was overestimated and will be adjusted for future rowing events.
- Lanes should be allocated from closest to the finishing tower, not furthest away.
- Bow numbers should be implemented from now on to aid finishing tower and starter staff.
- Social race largely a non-event. While it provides another event it does appear to be a bit of a time waster and should be abandoned. Any other way of utilising the venue prior to the official races should be considered given the high venue expense paid. One of the colleges pulled out of the social race at the last minute, further adding to its insignificance.

Incidents/Recommendations for 2020:

- While the umpiring was deemed to be consistent across the board for all fixtures, concerns were raised that they were slightly liberal in some of their calls, resulting in potential dangerous play. There were one or two instances of players getting hit due to high sticks and elevated balls. This is something that can be easily addressed before the commencement of next year's tournament.
- Encourage more college staff to attend the final night of the Hockey tournament to ensure college spectators are better managed and are held accountable for their actions.

Incidents/Recommendations for 2020:

- Address rules for when matches are tied at full time or teams win in extra time/penalty shootout. All sports across Intercol calendar should be consistent with these rulings where possible.
- We had an unfortunate incident involving a College resident verbally abusing an SUSF staff member. It is essential that College residents man the scoreboard for future events.
- Things got a bit nasty in the final Rosebowl fixture due to the referee losing control of the game. SUSF Management and Ignite Refereeing need to keep communication lines strong in the lead-up to the final evening of play. The decision of using the ref in question for the final fixture was a surprising one. The situation could have been avoided simply by holding a brief meeting beforehand.
- Sporting convenors need to stay focused and take their responsibilities seriously. Food for officials and St John's Ambulance personnel was sometimes late and in one case forgotten altogether.
