



Terms & Conditions of enrolling in any SUSF First Aid Courses during the COVID-19 Pandemic

As a participant in any SUSF First Aid Course you must agree to the following terms and conditions.

By attending and participating in any SUSF First Aid Course, you hereby acknowledge and accept you:

- To your knowledge, have not been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days
- Do not have flu-like symptoms
- You acknowledge the risk of attending the University of Sydney Campus
- If you have not downloaded the COVID-safe App, you agree to leave your name and number with the facilitator running the First Aid Course, and you agree your name and contact details may be used for the purpose of contact tracing should SUSF discover a positive test for COVID-19
- That the maximum number of participants in each area of SUSF will be 20, including the coach, trainer or SUSF employee.
- You will inform SUSF as soon as possible via the First Aid facilitator or legal@sport.usyd.edu.au should you test positive for COVID-19
- If requested by an SUSF representative or First Aid facilitator, you agree to have your temperature tested

You are further advised to:

- Wash/sterilise your hands before and after the First Aide Course
- Avoid touching your face during the First Aid Course
- Not to share water bottles and bring your own full bottle
- Keep your distance (1.5m) from other people

If you present as sick during the SUSF First Aid Course, the following will apply:

- If you are showing signs of a temperature or flu-like symptoms during the SUSF First Aid Course, the facilitator will:
 1. Isolate you in a safe environment;
 2. Immediately contact the emergency contact;

Further to this, the following strategies have been implemented to reduce the spread of COVID-19 at SUSF First Aid Courses:

- Distances between chairs and manikins are now at least 1.5m apart
- Are pumps are being used to simulate and replace actual breaths to administer CPR on manikins
- Hand sanitizer is readily available at all times
