- Sydney University Rugby League Football Club (SURLFC) has a long and rich history, dating back to its formation in 1920 by Herbert Vere 'Doc' Evatt.
- SURLFC joined the NSWRL competition in 1920 as the 11th club alongside the St George Dragons. The club played in the 1926 grand final against the South Sydney Rabbitohs and has produced two Kangaroos, Ray Morris and Jim Craig, as well as 12 NSW representatives during the club's golden years.
- It is committed to the growth and promotion of participation in rugby league amongst the 65,000 students enrolled at the University of Sydney at any one time through support, mentoring and scholarships for rugby league players at all levels.

- SURLFC continued to show support to Life Blood and attended the blood bank to donate blood and plasma.
- In 2023 emphasis was placed as a club on the importance of acknowledging and paying respects to Australia's First Peoples where the team went away and reflected, coming together as players and staff to discuss how we can create change. The club also proudly wore our inaugural Indigenous jersey in an effort to promote discussion.

Dave Chadwick Scholarship (2017)

This scholarship was established in memory of the late Dave Chadwick who passed away in 2016. Dave was a very talented player with Sydney University Rugby League Football Club. He was awarded a Blue in Rugby League in 1964 and was a driving force behind the Club from 1962. He was involved with the Club for over 50 years as a player, coach, administrator and as a highly respected clubman.

Awarded for the first time in 2017 the David Chadwick Scholarship is awarded annually to a men's first grade SURLFC player who is studying at the University and is a member of the Elite Athlete Program.
