OVERVIEW

The 2024 Intercollegiate Sporting Calendar was a resounding success from both a competition and administrative perspective. We had positive engagement, a fantastic committee, with strong support and spirit shown by all competitors and supporters alike. The overall level of competition between the colleges was extremely strong and tighter than seen in previous years. All colleges and students should be extremely proud of their efforts.

Congratulations to St. Andrew's College for claiming the Rosebowl title for the 10th year in a row, while St Andrew's College and St Paul's College shared the Rawson Cup for the first time since 2020. As per the Intercollegiate Constitution on the basis that St Andrew's College won in 2023, St Andrew's College will retain the Rawson Cup in 2024.

The year was capped off with the Intercollegiate Sports Dinner hosted by St Paul's College where Lexi Butler from St John's College was named Convenor of the Year and the Sportsman and Sportswoman of the Year both came from Wesley College as Renee Findlay was named Sportswoman of the Year and Logan Staight was named Sportsman of the Year.

COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- In only its second year in the competition the St Paul's Rosebowl team won their first ever competition, taking out the Rowing by an incredible feat to win by 20+ seconds.
- Women's College clinching the win in the Swimming Carnival by 1 point.
- St John's College for their inaugural Rosebowl Hockey win (sharing the title with St Andrew's)
- St Andrew's College specially designed Indigenous Jersey for their Hockey and Rugby teams. The College held an internal Acknowledgement of Country prior to the finals.
- St John's College winning the Rawson Cup Rugby for the first time since 2011.
- A strong Semester 2 for Wesley College winning the both the Rawson Cup and Rosebowl in Basketball and Tennis.
- Sancta Sophia College claimed a soccer and basketball match win within the same week and finished the year strongly by dominating the field events at the Athletics Carnival.

- Overall, a highly competitive Rawson Cup competition which went right down to the wire with all four participating Colleges picking up at least one win throughout the year.

ROWING REPORT

- Congratulations to St Paul's College who secured the treble at the Intercollegiate Rowing Regatta, taking home the Rawson Cup (its 5th in a row), Rosebowl and the mixed social race.
- Sydney experienced its heaviest rainfall in one day prior to the Regatta, and some contingency planning was required to ensure we could go ahead. A big thank you for the team at the Penrith Regatta Centre for their efforts to get the centre ready in time.
- Also, thanks to Peter Wawn of SUBC for his support throughout the planning and delivery of the regatta. His expertise and knowledge made everything run smoothly from the start.
- There is a lot of cross over between Rugby and Rowing competitors, both at Club and College level, and this creates a clash of training schedule. The Sydney University Boat Club (SUBC) suggested moving the Rowing Regatta to be in Sem 2 (September onwards). This would also lead nicely into the Aus Boat Race (usually held in Oct–Nov) where the winning colleges of both Rawson Cup & Rosebowl compete against the best colleges from Melbourne University. This is something for the College Heads to consider for 2025.
- There was appetite from colleges to run a 'B' race. The hire fee wouldn't increase and would allow for greater participation numbers from the students.
- Congratulations to Luka Mattani from St Paul's College who was voted Rawson Rowing MVP and Freya Carmody also from St Paul's College who was voted Rosebowl Rowing MVP by the opposing college captains.

RUGBY REPORT

- Congratulations to St John’s College for their competition win, the first since 2011.
- For the past few years Wesley College has struggled to field a suitable front row which, for safety reasons, meant uncontested scrums were enforced. This was the case again in 2024 with Wesley College forfeiting all three matches, however we managed to play the games as friendlies with automatic wins to the opposition (except for Round 2 v St John’s College which was cancelled due to wet weather).
- The competition suffered some setbacks with both Rounds 2 and 3 being delayed due to the extreme wet weather Sydney was hit with in early May. Round 2 was played off campus at Latham Park (synthetic field) in order for the game to go ahead.
- There were high levels of crowd intoxication at the finals, resulting in several spectators being refused entry or having drinks confiscated on entry.
- One spectator suffered minor injuries falling down the stairs in the grandstand while trying to access the field at the end of the game.

- Congratulations to Wesley College for winning both the Rawson Cup and Rosebowl titles.
- There were two rounds of basketball which clashed with Palladian events. We were able to move the final night of the Rawson Cup competition earlier in the afternoon, so students were able to attend both events. Sydney Uni Sport will liaise the USU to ensure there are no clashes with Intercollegiate and Palladian events in 2025.
- We had one issue of poor crowd behaviour on night 1 of the basketball competition, with spectators arriving intoxicated and their alcohol confiscated. The issue was handled on the night and those responsible were asked to assist in the pack up of the courts. As a result, reminders were sent to all colleges on the code of conduct and appropriate behaviour. We saw no further issues for the remainder of the competition.

TENNIS REPORT

- Congratulations to Wesley College for winning both the Rawson Cup and Rosebowl titles for the second year in a row.
- There was a 3-way tie for third place in the Rosebowl with St John's, St Paul's and Women's all having two wins a piece.
- By some miracle we managed to get through both Rawson Cup and Rosebowl competitions without any weather disruptions!
- There was a clash this year with UniSport Nationals (which was held 2 weeks earlier than normal this year) meaning some students couldn't participate in both competitions. I'm advised UniSport Nationals will return to its normal scheduling (during Semester break) for 2025, which will avoid this clash happening again.
- The tennis competition is a big commitment for all players, with the long days. The biggest day running from 9am until 4pm. To help reduce the time commitment we played all the doubles matches at the same time across three courts followed by all the single matches.
- For future consideration, we may choose to run the Rosebowl and Rawson Cup concurrently (e.g 2 Rosebowl and 1 Rawson cup a week over three weeks) instead of one after the other, this will give students a bigger break between games and more time for other commitments.
- There was a considerable amount of 'playing the system' from all teams, featuring the suspected deigning of injuries in order to obtain more favourable match ups. This issue should be addressed prior to the 2025 tennis competition.
- There are concerns from the Sydney University Lawn Tennis Club (SULTC) about the wear and tear caused to the courts by the Intercollegiate competitions at a time when the courts are particularly busy with their own competitions. Following this year's competitions the courts needed to be closed for a number of days for extensive repair works to be carried out.
- Thanks to James Palmer from SULTC for his guidance with the tennis competition as well as Rouna Daley, Grace Bruce and Mackie Evans for their support on game days.

- Colleges should consider whether some distance running and field events could be held on campus in front of a good crowd on an earlier night in order to allow students who can’t get out to Sydney Olympic Park to cheer on their college, while also shortening the SOPA track meet slightly.

AFL GALA DAY

- Unfortunately, despite many efforts from Sydney Uni Sport and the student reps we couldn't make the AFL Gala Day work in 2024 due to the weather and running out of available days before the fields closed for cricket season.
- We have a solid concept and competition structure in place now and if there is interest from students and the support from Heads of College, we can look to run this in Semester 1 of 2025.

OTHER SPORTS

- St Paul's and St Andrew's managed to play a social game of Rugby League on St John's Oval in late September.
- We also received enquiries about running a Water Polo Gala Day, however there was not enough time to organise this event for 2024.

GENERAL BUSINESS & OBSERVATIONS

- There has been a significant increase in the price of services from St John Ambulance. Our observation is that they are not knowledgeable in sports specific injuries. Our recommendation is to enquire about the cost of replacing St John Ambulance with a having a sports physiotherapist, who are better experienced to deal with sports related injuries (in particular, basketball, rugby and soccer).
- A common issue is fixture swaps due to other college events. For 2025, we will endeavour to get all fixtures for the entire year to the student reps at the AGM, so all parties can work around clashes in a more timely manner. If swaps need to occur it should be for the colleges impacted to rearrange themselves.
- The schedule for Semester 2 is incredibly gruelling with Weeks 2-8 jam packed with Soccer, Tennis and Basketball, consideration should be given as to whether these can be more spread out.
- When scheduling the calendar, wet weather days need to be more spread out as fields don't usually re-open the day after.
- St John's College have expressed its desire for more events to be played on its Ovals.

- We had a lot of requests for the footage of the rugby final. Unfortunately, this wasn't filmed (as agreed by colleges in 2023). In hindsight it might be worth considering filming the final fixtures across all sports in 2025.
- Sydney Uni Sport's aspirations is to have an athletics track on campus in the future, SUAC has suggested trying to host some of the Intercollegiate athletics events on campus next year. This opportunity will receive further consideration by the Heads of Colleges.

SPECIAL MENTIONS

On a personal note, I must express my thanks to all the College Heads and management who have provided guidance and advice along the way, Daryl Davidson and his hard-working grounds team who battled to get us on the field on more than one occasion throughout 2024, and of course Ed Smith, CEO of Sydney Uni Sport for his confidence in me to manage and shape the program this year. The key to the ongoing success of Intercollegiate sport is the continued support of the Sydney Uni Sporting Clubs who I have mentioned above, their advice and support to deliver the competitions was invaluable.

The logistics and operations of each event ran extremely smoothly, with no major administrative issues experienced on the various event days. Thankfully, there was no incidents or breaches of the code of conduct which needed to be escalated to the Intercollegiate Tribunal.
