BLUES ASSOCIATION

The Sydney University Blues Association (SUBA) is a voluntary group, open to all Blue and Gold recipients. SUBA exists to raises funds for 'Blues' sporting scholarships and holds reunion functions for past Blue and Gold recipients throughout the year. It aims to maintain the traditions and keep recipients in touch with each other, their sporting clubs and the University.

A Blue is earned by sportsmen and women who are studying at the University of Sydney, competing at the highest level and have achieved outstanding sporting achievement throughout the year.

The first known Blue was awarded to Dr Lloyd Kevern Whitten in 1936 for Swimming, since then there has been 1,461 students awarded University Blues for their sporting achievements, including the 24 awarded this evening.

University Golds are awarded in recognition of outstanding and sustained service to Sydney Uni Sport or to one of our Sporting Clubs over a period of at least seven years. As of this evening there are now 190 University Gold recipients, first being awarded in 1980.

On behalf of SUBA, I wish to congratulate the 2024 Blues on your academic and sporting achievements and wish you well in your future endeavours. Congratulations also to this year's Gold recipients and thank you for your tireless support of Sydney Uni Sport, our sporting clubs and athletes.

A talented sprinter in his day, he was awarded a University Blue in 1963, he served as President for a number of years from 1974 to 1978, established the '78 Centenary Committee in advance of the club's 100-year anniversary as well contributing to the official club history From Time to Time. Pat graciously accepted the role of SUAC Patron in 2013 after mentoring

generations of student athletes including his own son and SUAC athlete, Paul Greene OLY. He continues to co-convene the '78 Club for alumni gatherings and provides inspirational speeches to current student athletes at club dinners linking the past with the present.



SIMON LEWIS

WATER POLO

Simon served as President of the Sydney Uni Women's Water Polo Club from 2012, Initially stepping in as a parent of a player. He took on the leadership role, and successfully stabilised the Club, leading it to win AWL Championships and produce Olympic representatives. Recognised as a positive role model, Simon remains a committee member after the merger of the Women's and Men's clubs in 2023. His leadership resulted in strong teams that excelled in

the Sydney Metro and Australian National League, featuring numerous Olympians. He also represented SUWPC at Water Polo NSW AGMs and still is a member of SUSF CAC. Overall, Simon is celebrated for his long-term commitment and contributions to the Club.



PATRICK LLOYD

SOCCER

Patrick served Sydney Uni Soccer Football Club from 2002 to 2017, primarily as a coach, the Men's All Age Coordinator $\boldsymbol{\epsilon}$ Convenor as well as player. He oversaw team administration, organised trials, and increased Men's All Age teams by 75%. Pat also represented the Club in association meetings and frequently coached teams, integrating new players on a seasonal basis. He was the driving force and major contributor of club culture during this time

organising social events, like pub golf and the end of season presentation nights. He has been a great ambassador for the Club and supported the local league by refereeing over 100 games.





CHARLES MOORE

ROWING

Charles joined the Sydney Uni Boat Club in 1961 and served as its secretary from 1962 to 1963. After spending the latter half of the 1960s in London, he returned to Sydney in 1971, re-engaging with SUBC and taking on the role of chief fundraiser for the club's activities and tours. His first major project helped the club embark on its inaugural tour to New Zealand. Charles continued in this fundraising capacity until 1987, notably leading efforts to repair the Linley

Point Boatshed pontoon and, in 1992, overseeing the restoration of the flying piers at the same location. Since then, he has shifted his focus toward mentorship, dedicating over 25 years to supporting Chris Noel. Charles remains a crucial contributor to the club's philanthropic initiatives and plays a vital role in maintaining the connection between SUBC alumni and the club.




MICHAEL MURRAY
