## Operating Rules

1. The event shall be conducted in accordance with the Inter-College Competitions Memorandum, these by-laws and FIFA Laws of the Game as they apply in the year of competition.
2. In the case of conflict between the FIFA Laws of the Game and these Sporting By-Laws, the FIFA laws of the Game shall have over-riding authority.
3. The following additional rules are to be adhered to:
  - A. For Rawson Cup and Rosebowl competition each match shall consist of two 45-minute halves.
  - B. A maximum of 5 substitutions can be used per half.
  - C. Any player being ordered-off by the referee shall be required to appear before the Disciplinary Tribunal.
4. In the event of wet weather causing closure of the ground, the following rules shall apply, unless all college team captains agree otherwise:
  - A. Any washed-out fixture will be rescheduled to the allotted 'spare day'
  - B. If there are no remaining 'spare days' the fixture will be rescheduled, by a vote of the Sports Committee, as soon as practicably possible.
  - C. Teams must make themselves available to play on the 'spare day' or other day as decided by the committee.
5. If for unforeseen circumstances the match must be abandoned, whilst in play and before the completion of the match the following protocol is to be observed:
  - A. The match will recommence on the allotted 'spare day'.
  - B. If there are no remaining 'spare days' the fixture will be rescheduled, by a vote of the Sports Committee, as soon as practicably possible.
  - C. The match will recommence as a new fixture, with no reference to the score or time of abandonment of the previously abandoned match.

## Competition Format

Every College shall play each other according to the draw set out in the Rawson and Rosebowl Rules.

## Point Scoring

- To determine the final result of the competition, the following points shall be awarded for each fixture.
  - D. The winning College shall receive 2 points
  - E. Both Colleges shall receive 1 point for a tied match
  - F. The losing College shall receive 0 points

The final placings shall be awarded according to the aggregate of points accumulated by each College, as outlined in section 1.2 of the Rawson and Rosebowl Rules.

## Officials

- The appointment of suitably accredited Match Officials is the responsibility of Sydney Uni Sport as managers of the competition.

- A suitably accredited Referee shall officiate at each fixture.
- In the absence of officially appointed Assistant Referees, a member of each competing College shall act as Assistant Referee.
- A member of each competing College shall act as a score official.

## Duties of Convenor

The Sydney Uni Sport Manager shall allocate duties in connection with the convenorship of each Rawson and Rosebowl sport.

## Event & Venue Info/Conditions

### Alcohol Policy

- BYO and consumption of alcohol is NOT permitted at any of the University Ovals or on/within any other Sydney Uni Sport grounds and facilities.
- Please do not bring alcohol into any of the venues as it is not permitted. Persons found consuming or in possession of alcohol may be asked to leave immediately, by event and/or college staff. The exception is the Soccer Finals played at the SUFG where the following rules apply:
  - As the SUFG Grandstand is a licensed venue, spectators cannot bring in their own alcohol. The Bar & Bistro will both be in operation for spectators to purchase food and drinks throughout the night.
  - Individuals caught bringing their own beverages into the spectator areas will have them confiscated and may risk being evicted from the premises.
  - Alcohol that is purchased from The Grandstand Bar & Bistro may be consumed within the licensed premises only and not taken away.
  - Anyone deemed intoxicated will be asked to leave the premises.
  - The SUFG is a smoke free venue, this includes vaping, anyone caught smoking will risk being removed from the premises.

### Player & Spectator Conduct

- Spectators must remain within the given spectator's area for your own safety, as well as that of players and event staff/officials.
- All players and spectators are expected to read, acknowledge and abide by the Intercol and Sydney Uni Sport codes of conduct.
- Misconduct will not be tolerated, and offending persons may be asked to leave the venue immediately and disciplinary action may follow.

### First Aid/Injuries

- A first aid professional will be present at all games.
- Ice and first aid kits will be available at the venue.
- In the event of a serious injury, please notify Sydney Uni Sport representative, an Intercol rep, college sports rep, event convenor, or head of college immediately.

### Rubbish

- A prompt clean-up of spectator areas is a condition of ground use.
- All colleges must ensure that each venue is cleared of all rubbish on departure from the premises.
