Operating Rules

- The event shall be conducted in accordance with the Inter-College Competitions Memorandum, these by-laws and World Rowing (FISA) Rules and Regulations as they apply in the year of competition.
- In the case of conflict between the FISA rules and these Sporting By-Laws, the FISA rules shall have over-riding authority.
- The following additional rules are to be adhered to:
 - All coxswains will be weighed on the morning of competition.
 - For the purpose of Rosebowl competition the weight of a coxswain must not be less than 50kg.
 - For the purpose of Rawson Cup competition the weight of a coxswain must not be less than 55kg.
 - If a coxswain weighs less than the prescribed weight, weights must be added to the boat to bring the mass of the coxswain to the level given above.
- If for unforeseen circumstances, such as extreme weather, the regatta is abandoned, the Sports Committee will reschedule the regatta as soon as practicably possible.

Competition Format

The competition shall consist of the following events:

- Rawson Cup Eights race over the distance of 2000m.
- Rosebowl Eights race over the distance of 2000m.
- A Mixed Eights (that is, four men and four women) over the distance of 1000m.
- The lane draw shall be as arranged by ballot at the Annual Meeting.
- The order of races shall be a rotation each year.

Officials

- The appointment of suitably accredited Match Officials is the responsibility of Sydney Uni Sport as managers of the competition.
- Three officials should be present at the rowing:
 - The starter.
 - A race umpire, who shall follow the crews up the course.
 - The finisher.

Duties of Convenor

The Sydney Uni Sport Manager shall allocate duties in connection with the convenorship of each Rawson and Rosebowl sport.

Event & Venue Info/Conditions

Venue Information

Enter the venue via Gate A from Castlereagh Road. Please park all vehicles in P3 and obey all signs. Parking is free of charge. No cars are to be parked near the boatshed or boat racks other than those trailers with boats on. Spectators and competitors are NOT allowed on the Southern bank of the venue, only the island. Security and/or event staff reserve the right to check bags and confiscate alcohol.

Alcohol Policy

- The regatta is a Dry/NO BYO event. Please do not bring alcohol to the venue.
- Persons found consuming or in possession of alcohol may be asked to leave the venue immediately by event and/or college staff, and further consequences may apply.

Spectator Conduct

- Spectators must remain within the given spectator's area for your own safety, as well as that of the crew and event staff/officials.
- All spectators are expected to read, acknowledge and abide by the Intercol and Sydney Uni Sport codes of conduct.
- Misconduct will not be tolerated, and offending persons may be asked to leave the venue immediately and disciplinary action may follow.

First Aid/Injuries

- A first aid professional will be present at the regatta.
- Ice and first aid kits will be available at the venue.
- In the event of a serious injury, please notify Sydney Uni Sport representative, an Intercol rep, college sports rep, event convenor, or head of college immediately.

Rubbish

- All colleges must ensure that the venue is cleared of all rubbish on departure from the premises.

Prohibited Activities

As stipulated by SIRC's conditions of venue hire, if any visitor carries out any of the listed prohibited activities, they will be asked to leave the venue immediately and may be reported to the NSW police:

- Use of indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening languages or images;
- Being intoxicated;
- Being in possession of or under the influence of illicit drugs;
- Behaving in an offensive or indecent manner;
- Smoking;
- Failing to comply with a reasonable request or direction from a venue authorized person;
- To drive, ride or park any vehicle including motor vehicles, bicycles or rollerblades on any grassed or landscaped area unless so directed by a venue authorized person;
- Interfering in any way with any habitat;
- Causing a nuisance through use of radios, music players or other broadcasting equipment;
- Camping or residing within the venue;
- Throwing rocks into the lakes;
- Entering areas that are fenced off, locked or closed to the public; and
- Having any items made of glass – please note that (with the exception of in the restaurant) the venue is a glass free zone.
- Venue management reserves the right to check bags on entry.
